We spoke a lot about the past tense in this session, and you had no problems using many of the six different ways we speak about the past in English, so excellent job. You are even using the present perfect continuous correctly now ("<u>I've been practising</u> a lot this week"), and the past perfect continuous ("<u>It had been snowing</u> all night, so the conditions were perfect in the morning").

Your 'flow' is much better now. You are joining your words as a native speaker would, and using contractions correctly.

Areas to improve:

Vocabulary:

As you know, there were a number of pronunciation errors.

The main ones to remember are:

- asked arskt not ask-ED (æskt)
- castle kars-el the 'T' is silent ('ka:sl)
- pronunciation remember, we say the verb 'pronounce': pre-nounce (pra'naons)
- But the noun 'pronunciation': pre-nunce- ee-ay-shen (pra nʌnsı 'eɪʃən)
- heard rhymes with bird! Does not rhyme with ear! (h3:d)

Grammar:

- It is incorrect to say: What means? You must say: What does _____ mean?
- You said: "If I don't work so much, I would go skiing much more" This was a good attempt at the 2nd conditional, which is the form we use for hypothetical situations. In the 'if clause', you must use past simple: Correct sentence: "If I didn't work so much, I would go skiing much more"
- Preposition: You said: "It depends of what you want" The correct sentence is: It depends on what you want
- Preposition: You said "He's married with my sister..." The correct sentence is: He's married to my sister...
